## ΕΝΤΥΠΩΣΊΑΣΕ Ο ΛΑΟΓΡΑΦΙΚΌΣ ΌΜΙΛΟΣ «ΤΖΑΝΙΔΆΚΗΣ» ΤΟ ΣΧΟΛΕΊΟ OAKLEIGH GRAMMAR



Επίσημη επίσκεψη πραγματοποίησε ο Λαογραφικός Όμιλος «Τζανιδάκης» στο ελληνορθόδοξο σχολείο Oakleigh Grammar λίγο πριν την επιστροφή τους στην Κρήτη αφήνοντας τις καλύτερες εντυπώσεις στους μαθητές.

Την Δευτέρα 18 Νοεμβρίου και λίγο πριν πάρουν το δρόμο της επιστροφής για τα πάτρια εδάφη, τα μέλη του Λαογραφικού Ομίλου «Τζανιδάκης» επισκέφτηκαν το ελληνορθόδοξο σχολείο Oakleigh Grammar που βρίσκεται στο προάστειο του Oakleigh.

Ο Διευθυντής του σχολείου κ. Mark Robertson και η Συντονίστρια Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και Κουλτούρας κα. Νατάσα Σπανού υποδέχτηκαν τον Πρόεδρο του Ομίλου κ. Χρήστα Τζανιδάκη μαζί με την σύζυγό του κα. Όλγα Κωστάκη και την δεκαμελή ομάδα οι οποίοι συνοδευόμενοι από τον Πρόεδρο Ένωσης Κοινοτήτων και Ενοριών της Ιεράς Αρχιεπισκοπής Αυστραλίας, κ. Αντώνη Τσουρδαλάκη, έφτασαν στο σχολείο λίγο μετά τις 10:00πμ.

Να σημειωθεί το σχολείο έχει συνεργαστεί και στο παρελθόν με τον Όμιλο «Τζανιδάκη» τόσο στην Αυστραλία όσο και στην Ελλάδα. Συγκεκριμένα, χοροδιδάσκαλοι του Ομίλου είχαν παραδώσει μαθήματα στους μαθητές τον Μάιο και τον Νοέμβριο του 2018, ενώ στο ταξίδι που είχε προγραμματίσει στην Ελλάδα το σχολείο το 2019 οι μαθητές είχαν παρακολουθήσει σεμινάρια στην σχολή του Ομίλου στο Ρέθυμνο.

Μετά από μια σύντομη ξενάγηση στους χώρους του σχολείου και την ανταλλαγή δώρων ανάμεσα στον Διευθυντή και στον Πρόεδρο του Ομίλου, οι προσκεκλημένη βρέθηκαν στο κλειστό αθλητικό κέντρο του σχολείου όπου και είχαν διοργανώσει σεμινάριο κρητικών χορών για τους μαθητές του Γυμνασίου. Οι μαθητές μέσα σε κλίμα γεμάτο ενθουσιασμό και πλημμυρισμένο από Κρητικές νότες, διδάχτηκαν σιγανό, συρτό και σούστα ενώ εντυπωσιάστηκαν από το πεντοζάλι που χόρεψε η χορευτική ομάδα.

Το σχολείο Oakleigh Grammar εκφράζει τις θερμές του ευχαριστίες στον Λαογραφικό Όμιλο «Τζανιδάκη» που τους επισκέφτηκε και έδωσε την ευκαιρία στους μαθητές να έρθουν σε επαφή με την Κρητική παράδοση. Τέτοιου είδους πρωτοβουλίες είναι εξαιρετικά σημαντικές για τους ομογενείς μαθητές της Αυστραλίας, καθώς τους βοηθούν να διατηρήσουν ζωντανές τις ρίζες τους και την εθνική τους ταυτότητα. Μέσα από αυτές τις ξεχωριστές δραστηριότητες, γνωρίζουν την ιστορία, τη γλώσσα, τις παραδόσεις και τις αξίες του Ελληνισμού, ενισχύοντας την περηφάνια για την κληρονομιά τους. Παράλληλα, αναπτύσσουν στενούς δεσμούς με την ελληνική παροικία και γίνονται γέφυρα πολιτισμού μέσα στην πολυπολιτισμική κοινωνία της Αυστραλίας.

## **CFANZ 2024 TRIP EXPERIENCE**

The trip was a spectacular experience. I have experienced some group trips in Greece before, but being a Cretan-focused trip made this one uniquely memorable and impactful. From all these voyages I have learned that nothing connects the diaspora to their homeland more than these kinds of experiences where we are truly immersed in the culture and lands of our roots. This alone makes the trip especially valuable for our Cretan youth so thank you to the Cretan Federation for making the initiative to create such an opportunity in the first place. The trip opened my eyes to a new world that was the Cretan culture: the dances, the food, the drinks, the music, the land. After hearing the youth sing along to Spilio and Lemonia Mou on the bus for the first time and then dance to live music at the taverna Omalos in Athens, I had instantly fallen in love with everything Cretan and could see why everyone on this trip had such a worthy passion for the culture. Meeting so many new people and enjoying the 'parea' really made this trip the wonderful experience that it was.

We spent a week in Athens, staying in the Hellenic Defence Forces Beachside Resort of Agios Andreas. Our time in Athens involved visiting the Naval, Airforce and Special Forces army bases of Attica. It was really cool to see inside a real battle ship, to be told all about the specs of a Rafale fighter jet by one of Greece's 'Top Guns', to see Mirage 2000-5 fighter jets take off into the sky at such impressive speeds that they disappear into inconceivable specs in the distance, and to watch Greece's special forces soldiers undertaking intense drills. We also enjoyed the many flavours of the Greek cuisine at different taverns, listened to live music and learned all about Greece's ancient landmarks such as the Panathenaean stadium and the Acropolis. Not to mention our boat cruise visiting three islands in one day, and the scenic railbiking across the expansive landscapes of Neo Peramo.

Our second week was in Crete, where we stayed near the beautiful Venetian port of Chania, and later in Rethymno, as well as a day visit to Herakleion. Taking part in Chania's last 'Strata' for the season was a surreal opportunity where we got to sing with a live band, walking from the edges of Chania port to the town centre, stopping on the way to enjoy shots of raki with watermelon. At the centre we danced with the many Cretan dance groups of Chania before performing in front of all attending the event.

I had so much fun dancing in traditional Cretan costume to the beat of the laouto and the rhythm of the Cretan lyra as the musicians sang, seeing so many other Cretans, in their variety of traditional costumes, dancing with us, on the very land this culture came from.

In Rethymno, Laografikos Omilos Tzanidaki held a dance workshop for us in their studio, in which we learned both dances, and all about the Cretan costumes, followed by an outing in the beautiful old town. It was also wonderful being provided a tour by one of the priests of Arkadi monastery in which we got to witness the historical evidence that remains from the holocaust that occurred there in 1866.

## 2025 NATIONAL YOUTH TRIP TO GREECE

The Cretan Federation of Australia & New Zealand, in conjunction with CLIMS of the Hellenic National Defence General Staff, is hosting the 2025 National Youth Trip to Greece comprising of an educational, social, informative, historical and cultural program.

This program is initially open to youth from our Federation Member Organisations in Australia and New Zealand, until the 7th of February 2025. It will then be opened to the other Greek youth. CLIMS will be covering the expenses for the Accommodation, Bus Transfers, Meals, Events and Tour Guides in Athens.

Each Youth participant, must cover their international and domestic return airfares to Greece and back, as well as from Athens to Crete and back. The trip will take place on and around the Winter School Holiday Period. The proposed dates are Wednesday 23rd July 2025 to Saturday 9th August 2025. Registration/Booking Cost is \$ 300.00 per participant. Please note, this is non-refundable except in exceptional circumstances.

As decided by the CFANZ at previous Annual General Meetings, participants must be either members of, or children of members of the Federation's Organisations. They must be between the ages of 18 and 25. Each Association has been allocated three spots up until Friday the 7th of February. After this date, all spots not taken up, will be re allocated to the other Associations. Priority will be given to Youth that did not attend the 2023 and 2024 Youth Trips and within the age bracket above.
